Services: Full-service base wide biological support: biological assessments, endangered species protocol surveys, USFWS and CDFW consultation, botanical surveys, fence construction and maintenance, exclusion and removal of special status species, and construction monitoring.

Description: CCCI installed over three miles of wildlife fencing at sites to exclude federally and state-listed California tiger salamanders (CTS), California red-legged frogs (CRLF), and Alameda whipsnakes from remediation sites and, coordinating with USFWS and CDFW, conducted pit-fall trapping for five years to remove special-status animals from the action areas. This allowed the Navy to remediate the action areas without harming the listed animals.



CCCI biologists also performed day and night surveys for CRLF, and weekly nesting bird surveys for migratory birds and special status raptors, such as burrowing owls and golden eagles.

CCCI biologists conducted an education program for all personnel conducting site remediation, and monitored their work to ensure special-status species were not harmed. After remediation, the inland portion of the base will be turned over to the City of Concord for reuse.

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
